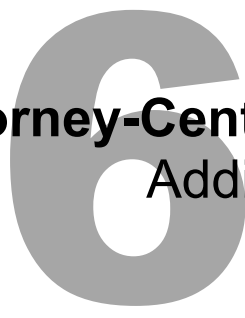




# The **Attorney-Centric** Approach to Time Recovers Additional Billable Hours Per Month\*



## Attorney-Centric **Is**

## ... it **Is Not**

**Everywhere** the attorney works

**Limited** to the firm's IT infrastructure

Reporting the attention of the **attorney**  
(e.g. "How long was I working on this Word document?")

"How long was this document checked out from the **system**?"

Controlled by the attorney through **opting in** and managing privacy

**Pushed** onto resistant attorneys who do not need or want the help

Scalable, expensed investment by **subscription**

A firm-wide, capital **commitment**

**Passive**, requiring no input by the attorney to get maximum value

Popups or **interruption** to workflow

An **information** resource to help recover attorney time

Time entry, or any other workflow **tool** that requires training

Attorneys **read** a report reminding them of their time

Another application attorneys must take time to **use**
